## CURRICULUM



One of our key priorities this year has been to develop our curriculum and we are excited to begin our project and concept based 'Curriculum with HEART' approach in September.

Each project will ensure all learning leads to a real and purposeful outcome to share with parents. Our first term will be our CREATE term with art and computing taking a lead focus across the whole school. To launch this and enhance the children's experiences we are excited to be taking the whole school to Southampton Art Gallery in early September. We are working with local artists to arrange school visits - if you (or you know of anyone who) would like to share their art skills with the children please contact the school office. There will be opportunities to come into school to take part in a 'CREATE' session with the children and you will also be invited to our whole school art gallery at the end of the projects. More outcome information will follow in the Autumn term.

## THE GREAT OUTDOORS

You may have noticed our amazing new vegetable planters near the house filled with seeds and plants ! We have been working hard to develop the school grounds so that our children can have more opportunities to work outside and be outside.... This is still a work in progress but we have now employed a part time gardener to help us to bring the gardens to life so that they can enhance aspects of the science, geography, art and PSHE curriculums...our vision is that the children will be outdoors much more often embracing all that our unique setting has to offer.

## SHOES

To enable all children to enjoy the outdoors frequently, we are asking that all children have both **outdoor and indoor** shoes from September. This is to protect both their footwear and our new carpets which are being installed over the summer holidays ! We will be providing suitable shoe storage indoors for all children and ask that children change their shoes at the classroom door before coming in, in the morning, at break and lunch and before going home. Their indoor shoes can therefore remain in school if they wish.

**Indoor shoes** must be **plain black** but do not have to be school shoes. They may be plimsolls, soft black trainers or something similar that enables the children to look smart, be comfortable and ready to learn. For younger children, please may you ensure that the indoor shoes are easy to put on and do up as the children will be changing a few times during the day.

**Outdoor shoes** need to be suitable for running and playing in as well as being in the garden and on the field - these may be their PE trainers.

Additional wellies are welcome too if you would like or according to the weather.

## ATTENDANCE

Thank you to all those families who have worked hard to ensure their children are in school every day and ready to learn. Our whole school attendance figure of 94.43% is in line with the national average. We believe as a school that we want to achieve a higher rate than this as we know that good attendance reduces gaps in learning and therefore has long term benefits. In September, please ensure that your child is in school by 8.50 a.m. to allow them to be registered. Any late comers will have to sign in at the office.

## READING and NUMBERS

A number of parents have approached us to ask about what they could be doing at home to ensure that their children do not forget their learning over the holidays. Please, please support your children to keep reading! Hampshire libraries are running their summer reading challenge and we would love to celebrate any children in assembly who complete this.

## **NEW SCHOOL ENTRANCE**

From September, the school offices will be based in the school house. This will enable us to have more rooms within the school to work with individuals and small groups of children for focussed work. We are very excited to be re-carpeting the school, refitting the boys toilets and using the house for Busy Bees wrap around care. We have a busy summer ahead!

The new entrance for all children will be the gate at the far end of the track by the house. Parents are welcome in and children will be greeted at the gate opposite the house / by the play equipment to then walk to their classrooms. Wagtails parents may accompany their children to the classroom door. For all other children, the staff member on the gate will pass any messages on to the class teachers. We ask that all children in year groups 1-6 make their way independently to their classrooms so that teachers can start teaching straightaway. Class teachers will be available at the end of the day at pick up if you would like to catch up with them.
